



XP (EXPERIENCE)

WIRED | WIRED WALL

THE SET-UP

For this XP, students will intentionally notice all the ways they see God's wiring in the world and the people around them. Each week they will have the opportunity to write about something they noticed on a card and place it on the Wired Wall in your student ministry environment.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Neon note cards
- Permanent markers
- Printed Wired Poster (found in your Graphic Support folder)
- Black fabric (a black flat sheet would work)

THE HOW-TO

To create the Wired Wall, you can use any blank wall or attach black fabric to a large wall space. Print the Poster image included in your Graphic Support folder and attach it to the center of the wall.

After session one, encourage your middle schoolers to look for evidence of God and His wiring throughout the series. It can be ways that they see His wiring in the world around them (in nature), ways they see His image in the people around them, or other ways they've seen evidence of God in their everyday lives. Each week, ask them to write a word or short description on the note cards and place them on the wired wall.

It may be helpful to ask students and small group leaders to take pictures of things they see that remind them of God's wiring in the world. Have them post it on Instagram and tag your middle school ministry as well as #wiredseries. You might want to print several of those posts each week and add them to the Wired Wall before each session.

At the end of this series, take a picture of the WIRED WALL and send it to small group leaders. Ask them to pass the image along to their students with a reminder of the bottom line from session one: The image of God is all around us.
