What if the story we were telling wasn't just about *me*—but about *we*?

The Bible doesn't start with us. It doesn't begin with our dreams, our struggles, or even our faith. It starts with Jesus.

It's His story first. The story of what God has done through His Son—through His life, His death, His resurrection. The story of how love moved toward the world, even when the world pushed love away.

But here's the beautiful thing: the story doesn't end with Jesus alone. It keeps going—through His people. Through a family formed by grace, not by genetics. A people called the Church. A *we*.

The Bible tells the story of Jesus—and then the story of the people who follow Him. It's a story full of broken people and unexpected heroes. Of failure and forgiveness. Of God sticking with His people, even when they wander.

It's not just a story we read. It's a story we're *in*. Because following Jesus was never meant to be something we do by ourselves. It's not a solo climb or a private journey. It's a life we live together.

We belong to each other.
We grow alongside one another.
We carry one another's burdens.
We cheer each other on.

This is why we matters. Because faith was always meant to be shared. Not just my story of what God is doing in me—but our story of what God is doing through us. The life of Jesus leads to the life of His people.

The story of *me* always finds its place inside the bigger story of *we*.
And that's where the real beauty begins.

THEOLOGICAL FOUNDATIONS

In the preschool years, a child will form their first impression of God's love.

God made me.

God loves me.

PHASE

The Preschool Phase

One-Year-Old—Four-Year-Old



➔ What is a phase?

A phase is a timeframe in a kid's life when you can leverage distinctive opportunities to influence their future.

At each phase, your job is simple . . .
Know what can be expected of them and know how they think so they will hear what you say and know what to do.

**It's just a phase,
don't miss it.**

➔ Thinks like . . .

A preschooler thinks like an artist.

Artists experience the world through activities that stimulate the five senses.

Like artists, preschoolers learn best when they can make it with their hands. They learn experientially, through their senses, from someone who responds to them.

➔ How they relate to God . . .

God's story is my story.

Preschoolers who think like artists blend the stories they hear with the stories they live in a way that makes a loaf and two fish just as memorable as yesterday's pizza. They relate to an invisible God they can imagine.

➔ Wants to know . . .

In first five years of life, a child forms impressions about themselves and the world.

The way a child resolves the "Am I . . . ?" questions of the phase establishes a critical foundation for their future.

The best way to resolve a preschooler's relational questions is to consistently embrace their physical needs.

Am I safe?

In the first year of life, a baby needs to know they are safe. When adults consistently respond to a baby's needs, babies establish trust.

Am I able?

When a toddler is one and two years old, they discover new abilities. When adults patiently allow toddlers to try new things, toddlers develop confidence.

Am I okay?

When a preschooler is three or four, they learn a few rules and expectations. When adults set boundaries and discipline with love, preschoolers cultivate self-control.
